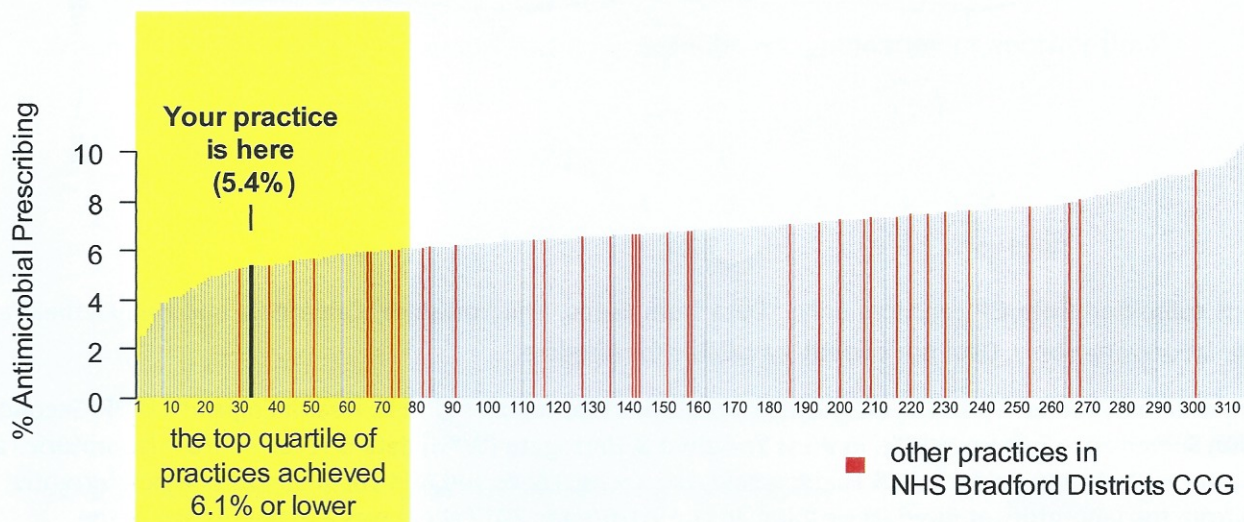


Can you reduce how many of your patient are prescribed an antibiotic?

Achievement in participating practices across West Yorkshire and Harrogate

The graph below demonstrates: Your practice (black bar) and percentage of the practice population prescribed an antibiotic (566) in the last 8 weeks; a lower value indicates better clinical practice.



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- ◆ Achievement throughout West Yorkshire and Harrogate overall (range 1.6% to 10.4%)
- ◆ The best achieving practices within West Yorkshire and Harrogate (yellow box – achieving 6.1% or below)
- ◆ Other practices within your CCG (red bars, NHS Bradford Districts CCG)

Aged 70+ and prescribed <i>Trimethoprim</i> for (UTI) urinary tract infection	11

Prescribed the broad spectrum antibiotic Co-amoxiclav excluding animal bites	29
COPD – rescue packs on repeat prescriptions (antibiotic & steroid)	33
